

Overview

Jane's Trust made 39 new grants in 2010. The total amount awarded in new grants and payments on previously committed multiple year grants was \$9,025,061.62. The average size of new grants was \$85,000. In addition to grants in the Trust's primary areas of interest, the Trustees made several grants for memberships as well as Trustee discretionary grants.

Nearly all of the Trust's grants in 2010 were for a single year. Grants were largely for program and operating support. When the Trustees made capital grants, they were for a specific and targeted purpose (facilities renovation, equipment to implement a program) or for projects nearing completion. Capital grants were generally not focused on contributions to a large capital campaign.

The Trust's primary focus continues to be promoting access to programs and services for underserved populations. Several themes were evident in the Trust's 2010 grants:

- Basic needs for vulnerable populations
- Access to educational opportunities
- Environmental and cultural programs for youth, schools and communities
- Health and well-being of children and families
- Preventing hunger and creating sustainable food systems
- Providing housing and shelter to those in need
- Programs and organizations that cross more than one of the Trust's interest areas
